#### **Educational Program**

Ms. Sally Layendecker, Vice President of the Ocala Camellia Society, was our guest lecturer. Sally is a Master Gardener and retired school teacher. Her talk was on "Everything camellia" and was filled with a wealth of information, starting with the story of the beginning of the use of the camellia leaves to make tea in ancient China. She gave a summary of the history of the spread of tea (Camellia Sinensis) cultivation around the world and the simultaneous spread of other more beautiful Camellia cultivars.

She described the diseases and pests of camellias and referred members to the website of the University of Florida Institute of Food and Agricultural Sciences (UF-IFAS), which has detailed descriptions of each problem and treatment protocols.

She detailed some of the history and uses of camellias in fashion, religion and literature, as well as some of the symbolism. For example, white camellias are considered bad luck or death in Japan. Pink camellias are for friends and red camellias mean love.

Sally brought handouts on camellia identification, flower waxing, the IFAS article on pests, diseases and treatments, and a feeding program called the "Ultimate Camellia Diet". This program includes nine suggested "foods" applied at appropriate times throughout the year and is reprinted below.

- A. Apply high-grade granular acid food
- B. Stern's Miracle-Gro Muracid
- C. Apply super-phosphate to soil now
- D. Apply generous amount of Black Kow cow manure
- E. Apply cottonseed meal
- F. Apply Ironite
- G. Apply soapy water, hose-end shower
- H. Sprinkle sulfur lightly
- I. Epsom salts now

Be sure to read the directions on each product twice and follow them closely. A terrific inoculated soil amendment called "Command" is made in Newberry, Florida by *LifeSoils* and costs \$18/40-lb. bag. Fifty pound bags of cottonseed meal can be purchased for \$14 each from *West End Milling Company* at 700 W Screven Street in Quitman, Georgia.
