HORTICULTURE

Camellia Blooms in Classes A, B, C, D, and E will be judged in accordance with American Camellia Society Rules by variety and arranged alphabetically according to accepted nomenclature. Awards - Blue, Red, and Yellow ribbons for each variety. These classes are open to amateurs only. All other species, will be judged together. Class F (seedlings) is open to amateurs and professionals alike. No duplications of awards in classes A, B, C, D, E, & G.

CLASS A -White Cards

Blooms grown in the open by amateurs. (Discretion of judges)

- DIV. 1 BEST BLOOM , Trophy & Rosette
RUNNER-UP BEST BLOOM, Rosette

CLASS B - Green Cards

Blooms grown under glass by amateurs.

- DIV. 1 BEST BLOOM 2½" to 5", Trophy & Rosette
RUNNER-UP 2½" to 5", Trophy & Rosette
DIV. 2 BEST BLOOM 5" and over, Trophy & Rosette
RUNNER-UP 5" and over, Trophy & Rosette

CLASS C - Yellow Cards

Reticulatas and hybrids with Reticulata parentage.

- DIV. 1 BEST BLOOM 2½" to 5", Trophy & Rosette
DIV. 2 BEST BLOOM 5" and over, Trophy & Rosette
RUNNER-UP 5" and over, Trophy & Rosette

CLASS D - Buff Cards

Miniature, 2½" and under, blooms grown in open or under glass by amateurs. Trophy will be awarded for BEST BLOOM.

CLASS E - Blue Cards

Hybrid. Japonica or other parentage, (not Retics). Blooms grown in open or under glass by amateurs. Trophy will be awarded for BEST BLOOM in class.

CLASS F - Pink Cards

Blooms from Seedlings.

- DIV. 1 Protected
DIV. 2 Unprotected

American Camellia Society awards are available at the discretion of the judges. If plants from seedlings have been sold commercially they are not eligible.

CLASS G

Best white japonica bloom in show over 2½", Trophy & Rosette.

CLASS H

Collections of Trays Under Glass. Blooms by amateurs. Trays furnished by Club. Awards are Blue, Red, and Yellow ribbons, and trophy for the best collection in each group. Exhibitors shall be limited to one entry in each of the 6 categories under Class H.

Japonica - Green Cards

- DIV. 1 A. Collections consisting of 3 different varieties
B. Collection consisting of 3 of the same variety
DIV. 2 A. Collection consisting of 5 different varieties
B. Collection consisting of 5 of same variety

Hybrid - Yellow Cards

- DIV. 1 A. Collection consisting of 3 different varieties
B. Collection consisting of 3 of same variety

CLASS J

Mutations. Awards are Blue, Red, Yellow ribbons.

AMERICAN CAMELLIA SOCIETY AWARDS

Gold Certificates for sweepstakes winner in each horticultural Class A, B, C, D, E, G, and H, awarded on blue ribbons won. In case of tie, red ribbons will decide.

Silver Certificate and trophy for runner-up. Counted on same basis as for Gold Certificate.

Highly Commended Certificate for Seedlings when judges consider it clearly distinctive from or notably superior to any variety now in commerce.

ENTRY CARDS

Exhibitors are requested to obtain entry cards prior to the date of show. Use only pencil, crayon, or rubber stamp. These are now available and may be obtained by applying to Camellia Secretary - 1201 E. Morehead - 376-4846. Please state class and number of cards desired. Official N. C. & S. C. entry cards, please.

RULES AND INFORMATION

1. Anyone interested may exhibit.
2. Entries will be accepted only between 8:00 am and 11:00 am, Saturday, February 25, except those from outside Mecklenburg County. No entries will be accepted after 11:30 am.
3. There will be a limit of 3 blooms of any one variety entered by an exhibitor, but no limits as to awards.
4. Each specimen should be named in accordance with the name approved by the American Camellia Society and as given in the "Camellia Nomenclature" 1978 edition published by the Southern California Camellia Society Inc. Insofar as possible, the Nomenclature Committee and the judges will write the approved name on the cards of entries entered under improper synonyms, i.e., flowers entered as "Empress" will be changed to, entered and judged as "Lady Clare".
5. Flowers entered under all horticultural classifications must be from plants owned by and in possession of the exhibitor not less than 30 days. Flowers for artistic arrangements may be obtained from any source.
6. Containers will be furnished for specimen blooms. Cut stems short. More than one bloom to a stem will disqualify the entry. Blooms shall have one and not more than two leaves.
7. Unnamed blooms will be identified, if possible. If not, they will be placed on a table provided for that purpose. They will not be judged.
8. If only one bloom of a variety is entered, it shall constitute a class and will be judged against a standard of perfection for that variety.
9. Judges may withhold any award, if in their opinion the entry is not up to the standard of excellence.
10. The receiving committee reserves the right to reject entries that are, in their opinion, not of show quality.
11. Wiring and waxing of blooms is permissible, provided it is attached to its own variety of wood and foliage.
12. While the club will use care for protection of all property used, it cannot be responsible for loss or damage. Owners should mark their property for identification.
13. The Show Committee reserves the right to interpret the rules and make further rules for the proper conduct of the show and to remove all faded entries from tables.
14. All blooms become the property of the club and will be burned by the show committee as a safeguard against spread of camellia petal blight.
