HORTICULTURE

Camellia Blooms in Classes A, B, C, D, and E will be judged in accordance with American Camellia Society Rules by variety and arranged alphabetically according to accepted nomenclature. Awards - Blue, Red, and Yellow ribbons for each variety. These classes are open to amateurs only. All other species, will be judged together. Class F (seedlings) is open to amateurs and professionals alike.

No duplications of awards in classes A, B, C, D, E, & G.

CLASS A -White Cards

Blooms grown in open by amateurs. (Discretion of judges)

BEST BLOOM, Trophy & Rosette RUNNER-UP, Trophy & Rosette

CLASS B -Green Cards

Japonica blooms grown under glass by amateurs.

DIV. 1 BEST BLOOM 21/2" to 5", Trophy & Rosette

RUNNER-UP 21/2" to 5", Trophy & Rosette

DIV. 2 BEST BLOOM 5" and over, Trophy & Rosette

RUNNER-UP 5" and over, Trophy & Rosette

CLASS C -Buff Cards

Miniature, 2%" and under, blooms grown in open or under glass by amateurs.

BEST BLOOM, Trophy & Rosette RUNNER-UP, Trophy & Rosette

CLASS D -Yellow Cards

Reticulates and hybrids with Reticulate parentage. Blooms grown in open or under glass by amateurs.

BEST BLOOM, Trophy & Rosette RUNNER-UP, Trophy & Rosette

CLASS E -Blue Cards

Hybrid, Japonica or other parentage (not Retics.). Blooms grown in open or under glass by amateurs.

CLASS K - White Cards

Collections of Trays Grown in Open. Blooms by amateurs. Trays furnished by Club. Awards are Blue, Red, and Yellow ribbons and trophy (DISCRETION OF JUDGES) for the hest collection in each division.

DIV. 1 Collection consisting of 3 of the same variety

DIV. 2 Collection consisting of 5 different varieties

AMERICAN CAMELLIA SOCIETY AWARDS

Gold Certificate and trophy (DISCRETION OF JUDGES) for sweepstakes winner awarded on Blue ribbons won in Class A, grown in open. In case of tie, Red ribbons will decide.

Gold Certificate and trophy for sweepstakes winner awarded on Blue ribbons won in Classes B, C, D, E, G, and H. In case of tie, Red ribbons will decide.

Silver Certificate and trophy for runner up sweepstakes winner in Classes B, C, D, E, G and H. Counted on same bases as for Gold Certificate.

Highly Commended Certificate for Seedlings when judges consider it clearly distinctive from or notably superior to any variety now in commerce,

ENTRY CARDS

Exhibitors are requested to obtain entry cards prior to the date of show. Use only pencil, crayon, or rubber stamp. These are now available and may be obtained by applying to Camellia Sectretary - 1201 E. Morehead - 376-4846. Please state class and number of cards desired. Official N. C. & S. C. entry cards, please.

RULES AND INFORMATION

- 1. Anyone interested may exhibit.
- 2. Entries will be accepted only between 7:30 am and 10:30 am, Saturday, March 6.
- There will be a limit of 3 blooms of any one variety entered by an exhibitor, but no limits as to awards.
- 4. Each specimen should be named in accordance with the name approved by the American Camellia Society and as given in the latest edition of "Camellia Nomenclature", published by the Southern California Camellia Society Inc. Insofar as possible, the Nomenclature Committee and the judges will write the approved name on the cards of entries entered under improper synonyms, i.e., flowers entered as "Empress" will be changed to, entered and judged as "Lady Clare".
- Flowers entered under all horticultural classifications must be from plants owned by and in possession of the exhibitor not less than 30 days.
- 6. Containers will be furnished for specimen blooms. Cut stems short. More than one bloom to a stem will disqualify the entry. Blooms shall have one and not more than two leaves.
- Unnamed blooms will be identified, if possible. If not, they will be placed on a table provided for that purpose. They will not be judged.
- If only one bloom of a variety is entered, it shall constitute a class and will be judged against a standard of perfection for that variety.
- Judges may withhold any award, if in their opinion the entry is not up to the standard of excellence.
- The receiving committee reserves the right to reject entries that are, in their opinion, not of show quality.
- 11. Wiring and waxing of blooms is permissible, provided it is attached to its own variety of wood and foliage.
- 12. The Show Committee reserves the right to interpret the rules and make further rules for the proper conduct of the show and to remove all faded entries from tables.
- 13. All blooms become the property of the club and will be burned by the show committee as a safeguard against spread of camellia petal blight.


