Restricted to non-commercial growers Camellia Japonica blooms grown inside or protected One Class – Chemically treated or untreated

DIVISION III

Restricted to non-commercial growers Hybrids and Reticulatas grown inside or outside, chemically treated or untreated

Class A – Hybrids with Reticulata parentage

Class B – Hybrids without Reticulata parentage

Class C - Reticulatas

DIVISION IV

Restricted to non-commercial growers Sasanquas and "Other Species" not listed above One Class, grown inside or outside, treated or untreated

DIVISION V

Unrestricted – open to non-commercial and commercial growers Camellia Japonica seedling blooms, grown inside or outside

- Class A 1 Chemically Treated Boutonniere (Under 3")
- Class A 2 Chemically Treated Medium to Large (3'' to 5'')
- Class A 3 Chemically Treated Very Large (Over 5")
- Class B 1 Untreated Boutonniere (Under 3")
- Class B 2 Untreated Medium to Large (3" to 5")

Class B - 3 Untreated - Very Large (Over 5")

DIVISION VI

Unrestricted – open to non-commercial and commercial growers Reticulata seedling blooms, grown inside or outside

Class A - 1 Chemically Treated – Boutonniere (Under 3")

Class A – 2 Chemically Treated – Medium to Large (3" to 5")

Class A – 3 Chemically Treated – Very Large (Over 5")

Class B – 1 Untreated – Boutonniere (Under 3'') Class B – 2 Untreated – Medium to Large (3'' to 5'')

Class B - 3 Untreated – Very Large (Over 5")

DIVISION VII

Unrestricted – open to non-commercial and commercial growers Hybrid seedling blooms, grown inside or outside

DIVISION VIII

Unrestricted – open to non-commercial and commercial growers Sasanqua seedling blooms, and seedling blooms from "Other Species" not listed in Divisions V through VII. Grown inside or outside

Class A – Sasanqua and/or Hiemalis seedling blooms, treated or untreated

Class B – "Other Species" seedling blooms, treated or untreated

DIVISION IX*

Unrestricted – open to non-commercial and commercial growers Mutants and Sports – Chemically treated or untreated

Class A – Mutants and Sports from plants grown outside or unprotected

Class B – Mutants and Sports from plants grown inside or protected

*This Division includes all UNREGISTERED Mutants or Sports of RECOGNIZED varieties of all Camellia species. Note: A simple variegation of a normally solid color is *not* a Mutant or Sport, (which must show a definite break in color and/or formation).

DIVISION X

Restricted to commercial growers Commercial Growers Division

One class – grown inside or outside Chemically treated or untreated

DIVISION XI

Judges Division: Restricted to competition between blooms exhibited by participating Judges. Blooms grown inside or outside. Chemically Treated or Untreated.

EXHIBITION RULES

1. The rules of the American Camellia Society for the judging of horticultural exhibits will govern the competitive divisions of the show. The management may establish such further rules as may be deemed necessary for the proper conduct of the show.

2. Competition in Divisions I, II, III and IV is open to all non-commercial growers. Competition in Divisions V, VI, VII and VIII, (Seedling Blooms) and Division IX (Mutant and Sports) is unrestricted. Division X is restricted to commercial growers. Division XI is restricted to Judges participating in this show.

3. All blooms must be tagged by the exhibitor with the DIVISION and CLASS in which entered, the varietal name, and the exhibitor's name and address. Entry tags must indicate whether grown protected or unprotected, chemically treated or untreated. Tags and containers will be provided by the management.

4. Two Entries Only, under the same variety, are allowed each exhibitor, and all entries must be made between 7:30 A.M. and 11:00 A.M.

5. All blooms exhibited must be from plants that have been owned by the exhibitor for not less than thirty days.

6. Disposal of all blooms will be at the discretion of the show officials. Blooms are usually destroyed by incineration, to prevent spread of Camellia Blight.

7. Placement of all blooms must be done by members of the Placement Committee only. Exhibitors are expressly requested to refrain from endeavoring to place their own blooms – this will not be permitted.
