Species Japonica

ANITA ROCHE - Rose Pink, some veining on petals. Large to very large, semidouble form. Upright growth. M. (U.S. 1999 – **Ken Hallstone Lafayette, CA**).

ASHLEY BLACK - Blush pink, flecked and occasionally streaked red, with a narrow white border at edge of petals. Miniature to small, formal double with 90 to 100 petals. Average, upright growth. M. (Sport of Japonica 'Grace Albritton'). (U.S. 2017 - Bob Black, Windsor, VA).

ASTRO NOVA - Japonica - White with Red stripes and spots with fimbriated petals. Large, semidouble to anemone form. Average, dense, upright growth. M. (U.S. 2002 – **Ken Hallstone, Lafayette, CA**).

BABY SIS BLUSH VARIEGATED - Light Blush Pink blotched White. (Virus variegated form of Japonica 'Baby Sis Blush'). (U.S. - Don Bergamini, Martinez, CA).

CAPT. DOUG SIMON - Black Red with Yellow anthers and Red filaments. Medium, semidouble to loose peony form with Red body and White tipped petaloids intermixed with stamens. Slow, dense growth. M-L. (Sport of Japonica 'Bob Hope'). (U.S. 2017 - Douglas Simon, Norfolk VA).

ELLA JOE - Clear Pink. **Medium**, formal double. Upright, average growth. M. (U.S. 2006 - Dick Hardison, Tallahassee, FL).

J BIRD VARIEGATED - Japonica - Dark Red with White variegation. Large, peony form. Average, open, upright growth. E-L. (U.S. 1999 - Jay Ellis Jr., Keystone Hts., FL). (**Formerly called JAY BIRD**).

KIFUKURIN BENIKARATO (YELLOW BORDERED RED ANEMONE) - Red. Miniature to small, anemone form flower with a tight, tufted center and five outer petals. Compact, upright growth. M-L. Variegated Yellowish Green on mid-green leaves. (Sport of Japonica 'Benikarako'). (Japan 1859 - Kantô area). (Replaces **KI-FUKURIN-BENTEN**)

KIKU-TOJI RED – Solid Red variation of Japonica ‘Kiku-Toji’.

HANA-NO-SATO (FLOWER VILLAGE) - Crimson with gold anthers and red filaments. Large, semidouble with 3-4 rows of petals with fluted and ruffled margins, standing apart and a center cylinder of about 50 stamens. M. (Japan 1975 - San-in Camellian Club, Matsu'e City, Shimane Prefecture).

MELODY SHEPHERD VARIEGATED - Bright Rose Red and White variation of ‘Melody **Shepherd**’. (U.S. 1977 - W. T. Shepherd, North Charleston, SC).

NANCY LEE EDWARDS - Japonica - Peach Pink. Small, rose form to formal double to peony form. Dense, upright growth. M-L. (U.S. 2002 – **Marion Edwards**, Jacksonville, FL).

MOSHIO - ('Flame (Australia)') Deep Red. Medium, semidouble. Upright, compact growth. M. (**Sport of Japonica 'Oki-no-nami**). (**Japan 1780 - Kantô area**).

OKI-NO-NAMI - **Pink edged White with dark Red stripes**. Large, semidouble. (**Japan 1710 - Kantô area**).

WEBB'S WHITE - White with Yellowish center. **Medium**, formal double. Average, upright, dense growth. (U.S. 1985 - Webb Hart, Slidell, LA).

WILLMETTA - Japonica - Apple Blossom Pink. Small, single resembling an apple blossom. Slow, open, willowy growth. (U.S. 1950 – **Will & Metta. Jensen, Kent, WA.**).

Species Reticulata and Hybrids With Reticulata Parentage

BEN FATHERREE - Rose. Large to very large, semidouble. Vigorous, open, upright growth. M-L. (Reticulata hybrid 'Arch of Triumph' x Reticulata/ Japonica hybrid). (U.S. 1980 - Pursel).

***MOUTANCHA** - Reticulata - ('Mudan Cha' - Chinese Name). Bright Pink veined White and striped White on inner petals. Large to very large, **full peony** with wavy, crinkled, crepe-like petals. Average growth. L. (Yunnan Reticulata). (China to U.S. 1948 - Descanso and Peer).

PIXIE DUST - Dark Intense Pink with flared light Yellow Anthers and light Yellow filaments. Medium, Single. Vigorous, upright growth. Cold hardy (-4 degrees); blooms don't shatter. E. (Sasanqua 'Mikunika' x Reticulata hybrid 'Kurenai'). (U.S. 2016 - Parks).

Hybrids With Other Than Reticulata Parentage

JINHUA'S JADE TRAY - ('Yupan Jinhua' - Chinese name) - White to Light Pink or Yellowish with Green tone, edged with Pink with Yellow anthers and Yellow filaments. Large to very large, anemone to peony form. Petals broad and wrinkled or serrated at the edges and waved. A large number of petaloids mixed with stamens forming a central raised ball. Vigorous, upright growth, Sweetly fragrant. E-L. (Williamsii x fragrant cultivar). (U.S. 2007 - John Wang, Orinda, CA). **(Not a Japonica).**

MIEKO TANAKA – Red with golden anthers and yellow filaments. Small, single. Average, well branched growth. Fall. (Vernalis 'Gaisen' x Japonica). (Japan Before 2008 – Tanaka).

PINK BOUQUET (MONROVIA) - Light Rose Pink fluorescent petals. Medium to large, semidouble. Vigorous, compact, upright growth. M. (Japonica 'Pink Parfait' x Saluenensis). (U.S. 1975 - Monrovia Nsy., Azusa, CA).

SURVIVOR (PARKS) - White. Single. Upright, compact growth. Cold hardy to -9°F. (Oleifera 'Narumi-Gata x Oleifera). (U.S. - Parks).

WENDZALEA - Glowing Ruby Red with Yellow anthers and Whitish filaments, Medium, single, Vigorous, upright growth. Blooms twice; once July to November and again February to March - prefers full sun. (Japonica 'Wendy' x C. azalea). (U.S. 2009 - Hulyn Smith).

Species Granthamiana

PINK GRANTHAMIANA – Pink with Yellow Anthers and Yellow Filaments. Large, single C. granthamiana style bloom. (U.S.1993 – Steve Campbell, CA).

Species Sasanqua

AUTUMN SURPRISE - Delicate Pink. **Miniature, semidouble to peony form. Average, upright growth. E. (U.S. 1965 – A. Rester, Bogalusa, LA). (Not a Japonica).**

OLD GLORY - White with dark pink edging with golden anthers and yellow filaments. Medium, wide open single to semidouble with sprayed stamens and ruffled petals. Upright growth. (U.S. 2009 - Nuccio's).

SEKIYÔ (SETTING SUN) - Sasanqua -Bright Pink. Large, single. Fragrant. E. **(Not a Japonica).**

Species Vernalis

DECEMBER ROSE - Vernalis - Rose Pink. Medium to large, semidouble. **Vigorous, spreading, upright growth. E-L. (U.S. 2002 – Nuccio's). (Not a Sasanqua)**
