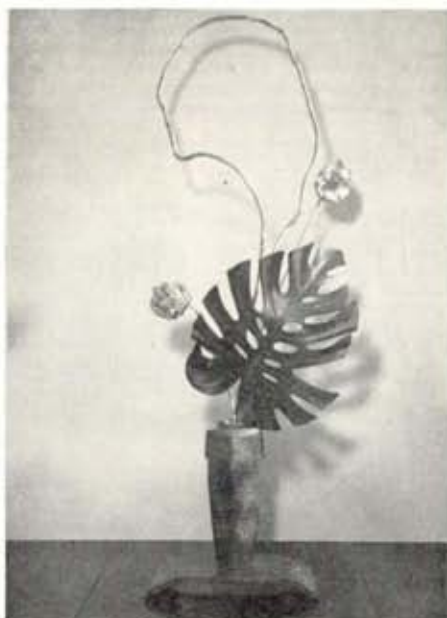
## ACS Arrangement Contest—1969-70

The 1969-70 American Camellia Society Arrangement Contest theme, "Camellias in Today's Moods", as chosen by the Chairman, Mrs. Paul Kincaid, offers a challenge to all arrangers. Although the photograph, as submitted with this article was done before the April 1969 publication of the American Camellia Society Magazine was off the press, it is interesting to note it classifies for entry according to the Schedule to be used for Camellia Shows throughout the Camellia belt.

This arrangement was done by my friend and neighbor, Mrs. John S. Harley, the former Mamie Lybrand. She is a gifted arranger, has a keen understanding of art principals, a member of South Carolina Nationally Accredited Judges Club, member and Instructor in the Iknobo School of Ikebana and Shofu Ikebana, (with teachers certificate) and member of Orangeburg Garden Club.

Mrs. Harley's arrangement easily fits in Section 1—"Tri-Color-Classes"—Class 111—"Law and Order"—"This we must restore, a Contemporary Arrangement with emphasis on bold forms and structural outlines" Mrs. Harley has used a handmade ceramic container of celydon green, placed on a polished walnut base. The split-



leafed philodendron gives proper weight for height of honeysuckle branch, on which solid pink Kumasaska Camellias are perched, back-to-back, against a pale green background. The suggested points for scoring this Class are: Design 30, Interpretation 20, Distinction and Asthetic Appeal 20, Freshness of Concept 15 and Relationship of all Elements 15.

The accompanying photograph scored by a secret panel totaled Design—28, Interpretation 19, Distinction and Asthetic Appeal—19, Freshness of Concept—14 and Relationship of all elements—15, thus making a total score of 95. An entry must score highest in Class in order to be entered in competition in the American Camellia Societies 69-70 Arrangement Contest. The original photograph, in this case meets the Contest requirements, as the print was a 5x7 inch glossy. (307)

# Insect Control

We are now in the age of Chemical Production. This is true with all agricultural crops and ornamentals.

Over the past several years great studies have been made in the use of various insecticides, fungicides, and herbicides.

One of the greatest is the control of pest with systemics (through the sap of the plant) materials.

Let me say in the beginning that in most areas it is recommended for use by professionals. This is because of the exactness of the material and dangers if not handled properly.

We have found it will work on numerous plants for the control of "sucking insects" such as aphids, scale, etc.

The material is applied carefully in a band under the limb spreads, worked in lightly. Watering hastens the effectiveness because the roots reserve it more quickly.

Di-syston is one of the materials that is proving most effective for the past several years in insect control.

One of the largest pecan growers in Guadalupe County, Texas, in 1967 was having trouble with aphids in his orchard.

Tests were set up on this farm, as well as throughout Texas. Good control was achieved by using a ten per

cent granular formulation of Di-syston at the rate of 20-30 pounds per acre each year for three successive years. There was season long aphid control. The grower harvested an excellent crop in 1967.

For the past several years working with one of our chemical companies we have found Di-syston very effective in the control of aphids, scale, and many other insects in field and ornamental crops.

Guess you are wondering when I will get to camellias. For two years we have used Di-syston on camellias and have not seen a sign of scale or aphids at anytime.

Our experience indicates it takes a little longer to get results, but it is most effective after several weeks.

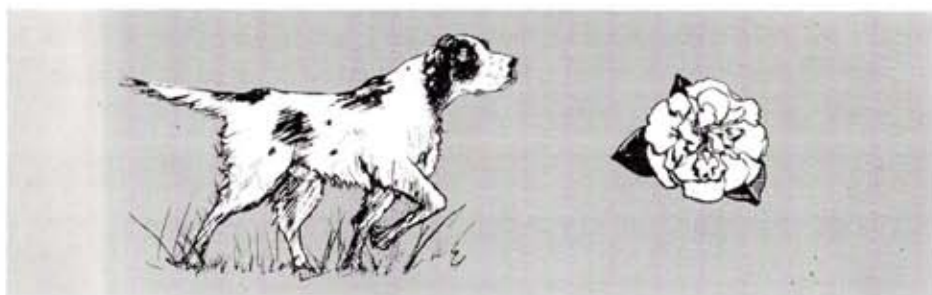
Di-syston applied in March and July, we find will keep plants free of these pest.

It works not only on camellias, but azaleas, hollies, etc.

What we have been using is the ten per cent formulation. Some of our growers are using the heavier concentrations most effectively.

You will note on the Di-syston container—"For use of Professionals." The material is not generally recommended so be sure and follow, most carefully, the directions on the label.

Josh and Nell Wilkes of Moultrie, Ga. are releasing their 'MARGARET SEARS'. This is a real deep flower, 6½ inches in diameter. It is light pink to 'TOMORROW PARK HILL' in color.

I know of two outstanding varieties in our state.

Bill McCord of Aiken is releasing 'MILENDA HACKETT'. It is a 7 inch flower, anemone form, an unusual pink in color with gold anthers.

'MISS MANDIE' originated by Neal Cox of Georgetown is similar to 'Miss CHARLESTON'. It is deep red in color with gold anthers and white filaments. The variegated flower is very Supreme in my opinion.

From the West coast comes, 'VALENTINE DAY'. It is very large, formal double with rose bud center, medium salmon pink.

'CANADA' is dark red, large, full peony. This flower was shown in Greensboro last year by Mr. Son Hackney of Charlotte. He made the trip around the belt ahead of us this year and got all available plants. I feel sure he would like for his friends to contact him for scions.

'FORTY-NINER' is a large, full peony brilliant red flower.

'RED VELVET' a sport of 'GUILIO NUCCIO' at Mrs. Leslie J. Richards bloomed true last season. Those who are fortunate enough to get a plant of this will be pleasantly surprised.

There is a true pink blush 'TOMORROW' in Mobile. It has bloomed true for 3 years. I'd like a scion, wouldn't you?

# Norfolk Hosts the American Camellia Society for the Third Time

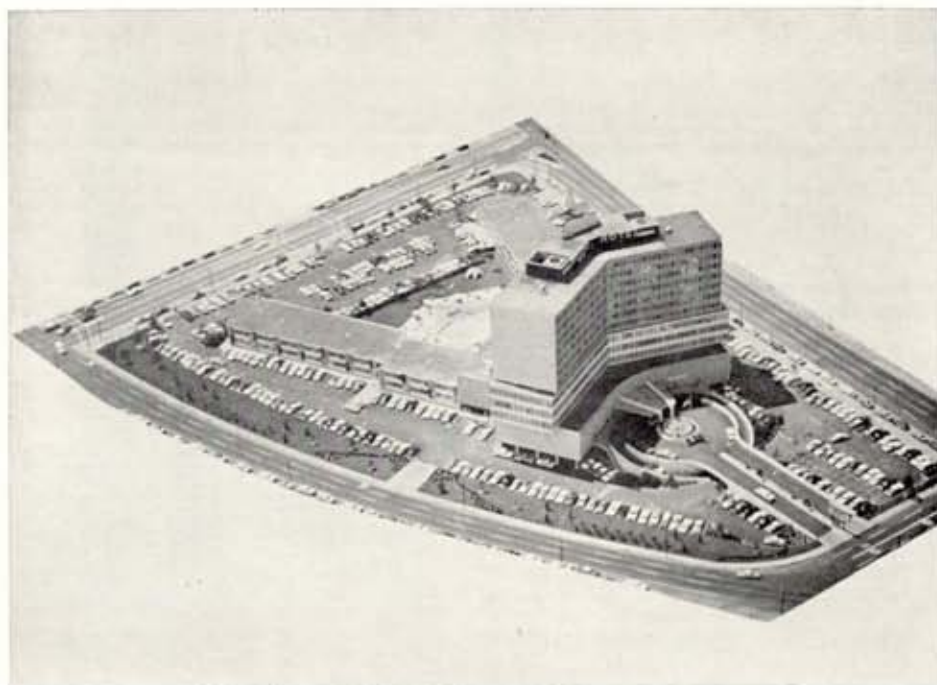
Fall meetings of the American Camellia Society, particularly since the advent of gibberellic acid, have become about as large and important as the annual meetings. In the early days of our Society, the Fall Board meeting was just that—no provision was made to entertain the membership, there were few Fall shows at that time. These were business meetings involving Board members only.

ACS has held two Annual meetings in Norfolk (Virginia Beach) first on March 19, 1952 and again on March

19, 1959. Both were outstanding successes so it is with considerable pleasure that we anticipate the Fall Meeting in Norfolk, November 13, 14, 15, 1969.

Since 1959 much of downtown Norfolk has been rebuilt. Magnificent buildings have replaced the older dilapidated sections. Our headquarters Motel, the Golden Triangle, is one of these new structures. This is adjacent to the downtown shopping district. See reservation card attached.

Norfolk is a beautiful and interest-

ing city historically. The Chesapeake Bay Bridge-Tunnel complex is an engineering masterpiece. This connects Norfolk with the eastern shore of Virginia and Maryland.

The Elizabethan Gardens at Manteo, and Kitty Hawk, site of the Wright Brothers' first flight, are interesting side trips via the Outer Banks on to Elizabeth City.

Preacher Parsons and Gene Worrell and their committees have planned excellent entertainment for us including trips to the Norfolk Botanic Garden, the MacArthur Memorial, hospitality hours, a luncheon and banquet, and the big Fall show.

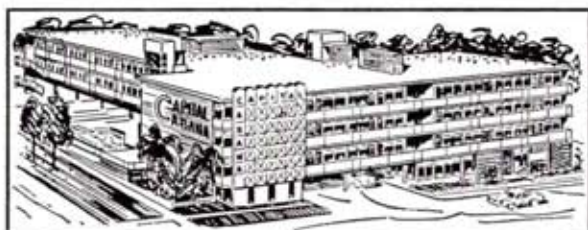

# Camellia Shows and Flowers

The past camellia season was rough for me because, though it was one of the finest years we've had for quality blooms, it was one of the busiest years I've had in business. This is a frustrating thing. When shows came along I would like to attend, the Judge would schedule a hearing in some case I had to attend. Nevertheless, despite these frustrations, I saw some fine shows and became acquainted with some beautiful varieties I had previously heard about but had never actually seen.

The first of the shows I was able to get to last year was in Moultrie, Georgia. This was not a tremendously large show, but it was unquestionably the finest from the standpoint of overall quality of blooms. Tallahassee had had a full week of foggy weather just prior to the show. Hundreds of blooms were brought into Moultrie by the Tallahassee growers, and their outdoor blooms were better than most greenhouse blooms seen in any show. Any time Tallahassee has a week of fog just before a show, the show they decide to attend will be out of this world.

At the Moultrie show, 'FASHIONATA' again caught the eye as being a really outstanding show bloom, and 'FRANCIE L.' jumped out at you in the hybrid section to shout in a loud voice that it is one of the best of the hybrid class. Dr. Louis Landau of Albany,

the new President of the South Georgia Camellia Society, had an 'EDELWEISS' on the head table which was an absolutely perfect flower. 'EDELWEISS' has proven to be one of the best whites for quite a few years.

This season I was once again impressed with the beauty of the seedling 'MARGARET SEARS' to be released by Josh Wilkes. 'MARGARET SEARS' is a big flower with a beautiful peony formation, but the thing that sets it apart from other varieties with which we are all familiar is the most unusual coloring which is a deep shading with an almost white center and a fluorescent deep pink edge. Everytime I have seen Josh Wilkes this year, I've tried to twist his arm into getting a plant, but he has been one of the most hard-headed old goats imaginable. I haven't even been able to get a scion out of him. It is my intention to be in Moultrie as soon as he decides he is going to open up and let this beauty go.

'TOBY ELLEN' impressed me as being a good flower. I only saw one bloom of this during the season, but it is the pink of a good 'JULIA FRANCE' and, for some reason, I have a definite weakness for these light pinks. 'FAINT WHISPER' showed some good blooms this year with its pink being only slightly darker than 'JULIA FRANCE'. I suppose 'FAINT WHISPER' is about the color of 'MISS MARY' and I bought



a plant of this variety because it appears to be worth having.

Another seedling that shows promise to me is Shackelford's 'TEENAGE QUEEN'. I would not be at all surprised if 'TEENAGE QUEEN' turned out to be one of the very best of the many fine Shackelford seedlings. It is a full semi-double to loose peony; light pink with an orchid cast; growing five to six inches and having an occasional deep pink stripe. This seedling should be a sporting variety as the stripe asserts itself and the plants start throwing sports, and that is always an interesting characteristic.

Shackelford was not as stubborn about 'TEENAGE QUEEN' as Josh was about 'MARGARET SEARS', so I was able to get a small plant and had five inch blooms without the use of gib, and blooms measuring slightly over six inches with gib.

At both Gulfport and Atlanta, 'MARGARET DAVIS' received an awful lot of attention and favorable comment. This is not an extremely large flower. As a matter of fact, the judges did not even send it to the head table in Gulfport, though it did make the table of honor in Atlanta. It is a beautiful thing with a picotee edge

and, though I doubt it will ever win a show, it is most interesting and well worth having.

'ELSIE RUTH MARSHALL' has been around for a few years and, from those who have the plant, apparently is not a real good grower. However, Son Hackney had a bloom in Atlanta that had been picked for five days at the time of the show and was so beautiful it literally made my mouth water. As a matter of fact, as I am dictating these notes for CAROLINA CAMELLIAS, I am on the way to Moultrie to buy a plant of 'ELSIE RUTH MARSHALL' from Josh Wilkes even though he told me the plant is not a healthy looking specimen. This one is much like 'MOONLIGHT SONATA' except the pink is somewhat darker.

I believe this bloom will be capable of winning shows.

Speaking of 'MOONLIGHT SONATA', it was one of the very best performers in my greenhouse growing show blooms one after the other to bring pleasure to me and those to whom I was able to give blooms. If you don't have 'MOONLIGHT SONATA', you certainly ought to go out and get it right now.

One bad piece of news respecting beautiful new varieties comes from the Atlanta show where Dr. Frank Houser of Macon had a perfect rose-form "TOMORROW" variegated that was out of this world. This bloom and F. N. Bush's seven-inch 'FASHIONATA' were the two top blooms in the Atlanta show, with the 'FASH-

IONATA' winning in a close vote. I talked to my good friend Dr. Houser with some of the scion scrounging gleam you so often see in the eyes of Son Hackney but was sadly disappointed to find this perfect bloom with a completely new form came from a small inside branch that had been gibbed so no eyes were available for grafting. This beautiful sport was lost, but the fact Dr. Houser's plant grew it indicates we can expect more good sports from 'TOMORROW'.

While we were in Sam Zerkowski's green house in Slidell, Louisiana, we saw 'LUCILLE DAVIS', a big white, and 'DR. LOUIS POLOZZI', another hybrid seedling. I'm not particularly fond of hybrids, but 'DR. LOUIS PALOZZI' is a pretty flower.

Sometime I am inclined to think

the medium blooms have beauty we too often overlook. In Birmingham I was lucky enough to be assigned to the team of judges whose duty was to roam the floor to pick out head table blooms overlooked by the other judges. Practically all the blooms we sent to the head table were medium blooms. Birmingham had a silver award for the best medium bloom in the show, and all of us have a tendency to overlook the medium blooms when we are judging. 'CATHERINE MARBURY', 'THELMA DALE BLUSH', and 'FLORENCE STRATTON BLUSH' were particularly outstanding in Birmingham and, though they probably will never make the head table in a show that doesn't have a special category for medium blooms, they are as beautiful as any of the tremendous

show winners we all seem to be drawn to as we walk down the exhibition table.

Finally, two of the best blooms seen all year were older varieties that were outstanding because of the exceptional variegation they contained. Neal Rogers had the finest 'NUCCIO' I had ever seen at the Gulfport show. It was in his commercial exhibit and so did not get to the head table, but if it had been able to make the competitive part of the show, it would have given everything a hard run for the money as would Sam Zerkowski's variegated 'TOMORROW'. Both of these blooms were 75 percent white with perfect beautiful moired effect throughout. I tried to buy a plant from Neal, but he was not certain he had a plant which would consistently

grow such variegations, so, being the fine person he is, he did not sell me. Sam said his 'TOMORROW' had been consistent on several plants and did send me a 'TOMORROW' I hope will grow magnificent blooms like that for me next year.

And so we come to the end of another camellia season with anticipation for the seasons still to come.
